2022 Budget Proposal Presentation

- 1. 7106 Residents (Census: April 1, 2020)
  - 7620 (Census: April 1, 2010)
    - Decrease of 514
- 2. Tax-Payers Support Services for nearly 4 Million Visitors Each Year
  - Borough receives a fraction of Pillow Tax generated county-wide
  - Small amount of revenue generated by Admissions Taxes
  - Bulk of Tourist revenue comes from Parking Fees
- 3. About 40% of Assessed Borough Property Value is Tax-Exempt



#### 2-Year Funding Certainty:

- Grants will be released in two increments
  - ½ following enactment
  - ½ 12-months following receipt of first payment

Cash Management:

NOT Subject to Cash

Management Improvement Act

30% of funds, or \$19.5 Billion, is obligated to cities with less than 50,000 residents

Grant calculations based on population size only

Gettysburg was included in with Non-Entitlement Units of Local Government






