ORDINANCE NO. <u>1478-21</u>

AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH COUNCIL OF THE BOROUGH OF GETTYSBURG, ADAMS COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA, AMENDING CHAPTER 13, PART 5, SECTION 505 OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE BOROUGH OF GETTYSBURG, RELATIVE TO THE LICENSE FEE FOR SOLICITATION OF CONTRIBUTIONS AND GIFTS WITHIN THE BOROUGH OF GETTYSBURG.

The Borough Council of the Borough of Gettysburg, Adams County, Pennsylvania, hereby enacts, adopts and ordains this Ordinance amending Chapter 13, Part 5, Section 505 of the Code of Ordinances of the Borough of Gettysburg as follows:

Part 5. SOLICITORS OF CONTRIBUTIONS AND GIFTS

SECTION 1: Chapter 13, Part 5, Section 505 shall be amended to read as follows:

"§ 13-505. Fee.

The fee required to be paid at the time of the making of an application for the issuance of a license hereunder shall be \$36.00. The payment of a fee for the making of an application hereunder shall not be required if the solicitation is to be made for the purpose of soliciting the contribution of gifts for charitable, religious, political, patriotic, community or educational purposes. Subsequently, any application fees for the issuance of a license hereunder may be authorized, set or amended from time to time by resolution of the Borough Council."

SECTION 2: All remaining provisions of Chapter 13, Part 5 of the Code of Ordinances of the Borough of Gettysburg shall remain in full force and effect unless otherwise repealed by any other ordinance. All ordinances, or parts of ordinances, conflicting with this Ordinance shall be and the same are hereby repealed insofar as the same affect this Ordinance.

SECTION 3: This Ordinance shall take effect upon enactment.
