President Wesley Heyser called the meeting to order at 7:00 PM with the following Councilors present: Vice President Matthew Moon, Mr. John Lawver, Mrs. Judith Butterfield, Mr. Christopher Berger and Ms. Patricia Lawson. Mr. Chad Carr was absent. Staff present included: Mayor Rita Frealing, Borough Manager Charles Gable; Assistant Borough Manager/Secretary Sara Stull; Tammy Murdorf, Finance Assistant, HR Coordinator Kara Riethmaier; Police Chief Robert Glenny; Director of Historic & Environmental Preservation Debra English; Planning Director Carly Marshall; Planning Management Assistant Karen Mesher; Code Compliance Officer Peter Griffioen; Parking Manager Rebecca Fissel; and Public Works Director Rob Harbaugh.

Others present included: Jill Sellers, President of Main Street Gettysburg; Erin Pedigree, Executive Director of Gettysburg Area Recreation Authority (GARA). Representing the press was Jim Hale with the *Gettysburg Times*; and filming by *Community Media-ACCTV*.

Special Presentation

Erin Pedigree, Executive Director of Gettysburg Area Recreation Authority (GARA) gave a brief presentation of the 2022 programs, funding and completed projects that have occurred at the Rec Park (see attached).

Councilwoman Butterfield asked if GARA was going to restore the mural on the amphitheater that is in need of repair. Erin responded yes they plan to restore and keep the mural on the amphitheater.

Councilwoman Lawson on behalf of Healthy Adams Pedestrian Bicycle Inc. (HAPBI) thanked Erin for GARA's help with the bike ride fund raiser they had in October.

Councilman Berger asked if there has been any vandalism occurring in the restrooms. Erin responded that they have not had any issues. She noted that the outdoor restrooms will be closed in the near future for the winter months due to winterizing them, but said that the Charlie Sterner Building restrooms will remain open during business hours over the winter months.

2023 Budget

Council President Heyser said to begin tonight's budget review with line item **411(fire)** on page 52 where Council left off at the meeting on October 24th. This section pertains to payroll reimbursements for the Gettysburg Fire Department business manager and custodian, and funds for the public utilities.

- 414:135 Contracted Services: Planning Director Marshall said that the zoning ordinance and official map are outdated and that revisions need to be made. She noted that the last update to the zoning ordinance was in 2008. Council consensus was to approve the \$61,000 to hire a firm to update the zoning ordinance.
- 430:313 Engineering and Architectural: Council President Heyser said that \$10,000 is budgeted for a study of the public works building.
- 445:373 Parking Building Repairs: Public Works Director Harbaugh explained that the dumpster pad in Race Horse Alley needs replaced so they plan to construct a brick structure at the same height as the current fence.
- 445:750 Parking Department Capital Purchase: Parking Manager Fissel said that the handheld enforcement devices are three and four years old and some need to be replaced She said that they also need to purchase one parking boot to replace the old one.
- **454:530 Appropriations: Council President Heyser** said that the Gettysburg Area Recreation Authority appropriation was increased from \$70,000 to \$75,000; Main Street Gettysburg appropriation was increased from \$40,000 to \$45,000; and Rabbittransit was increased from \$4,000 to \$4,750.
- 445:550 Special Event Appropriations: Council President Heyser said that Borough sponsorships of community-focused events will receive \$1,250 to help offset organizers cost which includes July 4th Celebration at GARA; New Year's Eve on Lincoln Square; Halloween Parade; Memorial Day Parade; Remembrance Day Parade; and Gettysburg Christmas Festival will receive \$2,750.

Council President Heyser said that this completes the general fund budget. He follow-up regarding **410:176 Police Regular Overtime:** which was reduced from \$74,000 to \$40,000.

Fund 96 – America Rescue Plan Act (ARPA)

Manager Gable explained that ARPA exists for the purpose of tracking the Borough's revenue from the treasury department in DC. Borough Council made a decision last year to utilize the 3.1 million dollars over the next four years for the purposes of the provisions of government service. It can be used towards staff salaries over the next four years.

Fund 18 - Capital Projects Fund and Fund 30 - Capital Reserves Fund

Manager Gable said that these funds are affiliated with the Capital Improvement Plan (CIP) through 2026 and that Council reviewed it extensively last year. He noted that staff plans to revisit and update the CIP in 2023.

2023 Fee Resolution

Council President Heyser said that the proposed changes to the Fee Resolution are mostly incremental changes and are highlighted in yellow.

Planning Director Marshall said that after further review with staff it was determined that due to the enforcement and amount of time to process an application for the Guided Walking Tours, she requested to increase the annual license fee from \$125.00 to \$300.00. Borough Council consensus is in favor of increasing this fee and asked that all licensees are notified of this change.

Council President Heyser said that with the proposed budget, the property tax rate is not going up next year.

Public Comment (open to items not on the agenda)

There was no public comments.

President Heyser adjourned the meeting to an executive session at 8:05 PM.








2021 Income & Expenses
