

COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES  
OCTOBER 11, 1982

President Shealer presided at the October meeting of Council attended by the following Council members - Ditzler, Witt, Madsen, Daniels, Romero, Miller and Heflin.

The minutes were approved as amended.

President Shealer reported Councilman Cluck has been discharged from the hospital and former Borough Manager Charles Kuhn recently underwent surgery at Hershey Medical Center. Mr. Kuhn will be discharged within a day or two.

Mayor Weikert announced "Trick or Treat" will be held October 28, 1982 from 6 to 8 PM. The Halloween Parade will be held October 26 at 7:30 PM - rain date October 27.

The Mayor reported receipt of a letter from the National Park Service commending Cpl. Gantz for conducting the Firearms School for Park Rangers.

Moved Mr. Ditzler seconded Mr. Heflin Council approve the amendment to the Zoning Ordinance prohibiting the operation of head shops, adult bookstores and massage parlors within the Borough. Motion carried by majority vote - Mrs. Daniels dissenting.

Moved Mr. Ditzler seconded Mr. Heflin the parking ordinance be amended to remove parking from the following locations:

1. West side of South Washington Street from old hospital entrance to Johns Street
  2. West side of South Washington Street from its intersection with Johns Street south 46 ft
  3. West side of South Washington Street from Kuhn Alley north 40 ft
  4. West side of Steinwehr Avenue from S. Washington St. south to Boro line
- Amendment to be advertised for November adoption. Motion carried.

Moved Mr. Ditzler seconded Mr. Madsen all approved bills (\$54,990.79) and payrolls be paid. Motion carried.

Moved Mrs. Daniels seconded Mr. Madsen Jane Nutter be appointed to fill vacancy on Rec Board created by the resignation of Barbara Wickerham. Miss Nutter's term to expire Sept. '86. Motion carried.

Moved Mrs. Daniels seconded Mr. Madsen letters of commendation be sent to Midget Football and Soccer Leagues. Motion carried.

Mrs. Romero reported the Rec Board questioned the possibility of placing a road thru the park to the bandshell. Council tabled the matter for further information.

Mrs. Romero reported she had been receiving complaints rel to speeding in Race Horse Alley; someone suggested placing "speed bumps". Safety Committee directed to study situation.

Utility Committee directed to study Barlow Street-East Lincoln Avenue section rel to need for additional street lighting.

Moved Mr. Miller seconded Mr. Madsen College Security be given the last parking space on West Stevens Street for Security Police use. Motion carried.

Moved Mr. Miller seconded Mr. Madsen Council adopt a Mutual-aid Agreement with the National Park Service. Motion carried.

Mr. Heflin reported sidewalk list will be presented next month. Mr. Heflin on behalf of the Fire Company thanked all who helped with the mini carnival with special thanks to Mayor Weikert, Chief Potter and Mrs. Daniels.

Moved Mr. Ditzler seconded Mr. Heflin Mr. Sterner be authorized to transfer \$34,036.31 (received from investment of Foreign Casualty Insurance) from General fund to Police Pension Fund. Motion carried.

3. Still negotiating with Chessie rel to storm sewer

6. Revenue Sharing - 1st public hearing for proposed use of 1983 funds will be held November 1, 1982 at 7 PM
7. Final Revenue Sharing hearing will be held December 13, 1982 at 7 PM
8. Budget work shop will be held following public hearing Nov. 1st.

Moved Mr. Heflin seconded Mr. Ditzler the dates for the '83 Outdoor Antique Shows -May 21 and September 24-be approved as requested by Retail Merchants Association. Motion carried.

Moved Mr. Madsen seconded Mr. Heflin the recommendation of G. H. Harris Associates for exoneration of Foster and Lena Beard for '80 and '81 personal taxes be rejected and Harris be instructed to proceed by filing charges before the Magistrate. Motion carried.

Moved Mr. Ditzler seconded Mr. Madsen the reports of the Mayor, Police Chief, Treasurer, Code Enforcement Officer and Fire Marshall be approved. Motion carried.


County Housing Authority be approved as HARB recommended and a certificate of appropriateness issued. Motion carried.
