MINUTES OF COUNCIL MEETING HELD DEC. 13, 1982

The December meeting of Council convened at 7:30 PM. President Shealer presided with all Council members in attendance.

The minutes were approved as read.

Ray Thompson and Robert Kenworthy were present to briefly outline the activities of the Rec Department since Mr. Thompson became the director. Mr. Kenworthy mentioned the benfits derived by the department from work the Borough highway crew does at the facility.

Russell Arkin outlined plans for renovation to the Fahnestock Building. Borough would apply to HUD for grant to enable him to proceed with plans.

Moved Mr. Witt seconded Mr. Miller the Borough assist Mr. Arkin in preparing application for grant to renovate Fahnestock Building. Motion carried.

Steve Wentz, Cumberland Valley Savings & Loan, ask Council to consider making Race Horse Alley one way (East). President Shealer announced Council the suggestion following the Zoning Hearing scheduled for December 28th.

Cindy Rewers appeared to request Council to install stop signs or a traffic signal at the Franklin-West Middle Street intersection. Was informed Sate approval needed for either suggestion.

Mayor Weikert reported Hurshel Shank completed mandatory police training at Hershey Academy on November 19th.

Moved Mr. Heflin seconded Mr. Ditzler Council approve Resolution 103-82 to apply for reimbursement of Ptlm Shank's training. Motion carried.

Mayor Weikert reported PFC Gliem and Cpl Gantz are scheduled to attend the Fire Academy for training in Arson & Fire Investigation.

Moved Mr. Ditzler seconded Mr. Heflin all approved bills and payrolls be paid. Motion carried.

Moved Mr. Ditzler seconded Mr. Madsen Council adopt 1983 Budget in the amount of \$1,000,452. Motion carried.

Moved Mr. Ditzler seconded Mr. Heflin Council adopt the Revenue Sharing Budget in the amount of \$114,250. Motion carried.

Mr. Ditzler announced the tax millage will remain same as '82. Real Estate 20 mills; Occupation 20 mills; per capita \$5.00.

Mr. Ditzler reported Finance Committee proposes Council consider adoption of a Mechanical Devices Tax. Ordinance Committee to study.

Moved Mr. Ditzler seconded Mr. Heflin the Treasurer be authorized to make interdepartmental transfers to bring all accounts to a zero balance at end of 1982. Motion carried.

Moved Mr. Madsen seconded Mrs. Daniels the YWCA on Lincoln Square retain "8", HG-AC (Lincoln Room) be assigned No. 12. Motion carried.

Moved Mrs. Daniels seconded Mr. Ditzler George T. Raffensperger be appointed to serve a five year term on Gettysburg Municipal Authority. Motion carried.

Moved Mrs. Daniels seconded Mr. Madsen Robert W. Weaner be appointed to a 5 year term on the Gettysburg School Board Authority. Motion carried.

Moved Mrs. Daniels seconded Mr. Madsen Robert M. Smith be appointed to a 5 year termon the Borough Planning & Zoning Commission. Motion carried.

Moved Mrs. Daniels seconded Mr. Madsen Council appoint Robert W. Weaner to a 3 year term on the Zoning Hearing Board. Motion carried.

Moved Mrs. Daniels seconded Mr. Madsen a letter of commendation be sent the Holiday Bureau for the service they render to the community each year prior to the holiday season. Motion carried.

Moved Mrs. Romero seconded Mr. Cluck an additional street light be erected on Howard Avenue near Buford Avenue. Motion carried.

Mr. Miller reported Police Contract will be ready next month. Safety Committee tabled the parking situation for Steinwehr Avenue & South Washington Street for further study.

Moved Mr. Miller seconded Mr. Madsen the 18 families, as listed, be recipients of the interest derived from the Eichelberger-Stahle Charity Funds. Motion carried. Mr. Miller, Mr. Sterner and Sgt. Sistrunk served on the committee to compile the list.

Moved Mr. Heflin seconded Mr. Ditzler Council adopt the 1983 Highway-aid Budget. Mr. Sterner to proceed with application for approval for proposed work. Motion carried.

Moved Mr. Heflin seconded Mr. Ditzler Borough advertise for bids for 1983 road building materials, pipe and equipment rental. Bids to be opened and read at January meeting and be awarded at February meeting. Motion carried.

Mr. Sterner's report:

- 1. Borough will again pick up Xmas trees.
- 2. New pole for traffic signal should be delivered within a month.
- 3. Penn Dot awaiting Council's action on removing parking on Steinwehr Avenue before acting on request for a left turn lane for northbound traffic
- 4. Check from Wolf Foundation (Lumber Yard) in the amount of \$1,000 received for appreciation of efforts of police and fire companies during recent fire.

Council directed the Finance Committee, Mr. Sterner and Mr. Lawver to determine distribution of the money.

Moved Mrs. Daniels seconded Mr. Witt a permit to display fireworks on January 6, 1983 be issued to Gettysburg College. Motion carried.

A letter of resignation was read from Borough Fire Marshall, Charles J. Kerrigan, effective December 31, 1982.

Moved Mr. Ditzler seconded Mr. Heflin Council accept Mr. Kerrigan's resignation. Motion carried.

Moved Mr. Madsen seconded Mr. Heflin John D. Lawver, Jr. be named Borough Fire Marshall, Mr. Lawver to attend school on Arson & Fire Investigation in January. Motion carried.

Moved Mr. Ditzler seconded Mr. Heflin the reports of the Mayor, Chief of Police, Treasurer and Code Enforcement Officer be accepted. Motion carried.

Moved Mr. Heflin seconded Mrs. Daniels Council approve the proposal of the Linen Chest to place an awning as HARB recommended and a certificate of appropriateness issued. Motion carried.

Moved Mr. Heflin seconded Mr. Madsen Council approve the renovation proposal of Donald Nunemaker for his property on South Washington Street and issue a certificate of appropriateness. Motion carried.

Moved Mr. Ditzler seconded Council accept HARB Minutes. Motion carried.

Moved and seconded meeting adjourn at 9:30 PM. Motion carried.
