COUNCIL MEETING - FEBRUARY 14, 1983

The February meeting of Council was called to order at 7:30 PM by President Shealer. Council members present were: Mrs. Daniels and Mrs. Romero and Messrs. Cluck Miller, Witt, Ditzler and Madsen.

The minutes were approved as read.

Robert Weiland related the Retail Merchants concern with the plaster and other debris left after the demolition of the Columbian Building.

Mike Weider and Jim Mays expressed their opposition over the proposed Mechanical Devices Tax.

Moved Mrs. Daniels seconded Mr. Madsen Council approve the request of Gettysburg Artworks to conduct an Outdoor Craft Fair on May 7, 1983. Traffic to be removed from West High Street between South Washington Street and Alley parallel to South Washington Street, between 10 AM and 5 PM. Motion carried.

Moved Mrs. Daniels seconded Mr. Cluck the proposed Mechanical Device Tax Ordinance be advertised for March adoption. Motion carried by majority vote. Mr. Witt dissenting.

Moved Mrs. Daniels seconded Mr. Cluck the proposed ordinance regulating Yard Sales be advertised for March adoption. Motion carried.

Moved Mrs. Daniels seconded Mr. Cluck an amendment to the Animal Ordinance be for March adoption. The amendment, to the dog leash section, would curtail loud, harsh or barking noises. Motion carried.

Mr. Witt reported the Community Relations Committee questioned parking of vehicles along Taneytown Road. Council decreed "NO Parking" signs be erected in the area.

Moved Mr. Ditzler seconded Mr. Cluck the section of East Middle Street from the east curb line of 6th Street east to the Borough Line be removed from the Borough Street Plan and ownership of the land remain in the George A. Sachs Est. Motion carried.

Moved Mr. Ditzler seconded Mr. Cluck all approved bills and payrolls be paid. Motion carried.

Mayor Weikert reported that he, Chief Potter and the Safety Committee recommend that Patrolman Codori, effective February 6th and Patrolman Shank, effective February 20th be granted permanent status after having completed their probationary period.

Moved Mr. Miller seconded Mr. Cluck Patrolmen Codori and Shank be given permanent status with the Police Department. Motion carried.

Mrs. Romero reported the Rec Board is still interested in having their utility bills paid by the Borough.

Moved Mrs. D_a niels seconded Mr. Cluck Council approve Mayor Weikert's and President Shealer's suggestions that a resolution be adopted commending all fire departments and any others involved with the Lincoln Square Building fire. Motion carried.

Mayor Weikert commended the Borough Highway Crew for their excellant snow clean up.

Moved Mr. Madsen seconded Mr. Cluck that Willis Musselman, agent for non-uniform pension, be entitled to receive a fee for his services now that he has become a certified agent. Motion carried.

Moved Mr. Madsen seconded Mr. Witt Council approve the resolution recognizing the merger of Keystone Communicable Inc. with its parent corporation, Cable Investments, Inc. Motion carried.

Moved Mr. Madsen seconded Mr. Witt the list of exonerations as presented by G. H. Harris Associates be approved. Motion carried.

Moved Mr. Witt seconded Mr. Madsen the bid of Bethlehem Mines be accepted for 1983 stone purchases. #2RC & #2A - \$3.40 per ton and #1 & #4 - 3.60 per ton. Motion carried.
