

MINUTES OF MEETING HELD MARCH 12, 1984

The March meeting of Council was called to order at 7:30 PM by President Shealer. The following Council members were present: Messrs. Ditzler, Witt, Cluck, Hartzell, Schmitt, Delzingaro and Mrs. Daniels.

The minutes of the February meeting were approved as read.

Approximately 25 spectators attended - various interests including status of Hotel Gettysburg, student housing in R-2 District, proposed raise of meter rates.

President Shealer reported he had received a phone call from Michael Walkley, engineer rel to status of Hotel Gettysburg, stating present plans call for construction to begin on or before April 1st.

Moved Mr. Delzingaro seconded Mr. Hartzell the ordinance replacing meters in front of St. Francis School be adopted. Motion carried.

Mr. Delzingaro reported the Ordinance Committee is considering giving the Code Enforcement Officer power to issue non-traffic citations.

Moved Mr. Schmitt seconded Mr. Hartzell additional street lights be erected in Legion Alley at rear of "Big Jim's Beverages"; Zerfing Alley rear of Kennie's Market; Long Lane between King & Queen Streets. Motion carried.

Moved Mr. Ditzler seconded Mr. Schmitt all approved bills and payrolls be paid. Motion carried.

Moved Mr. Ditzler seconded Mr. Cluck the Borough's 1984 dues, \$75.00, be paid to Adams County Boroughs Association. Motion carried.

Mr. Sterner reported the underground gasoline tank at the Rec Park is leaking and must be replaced.

Moved Mr. Witt seconded Mr. Hartzell the final meter bag that had been issued for use by Avian Flu Task Force be removed, Motion carried.

Moved Mrs. Daniels seconded Mr. Ditzler a letter be sent opposing passage of Senate HB 188. Motion carried.

Mrs. Daniels reported Roy Thomas and Charles Harris will serve as co-chairman of the Community Garden Project. Mr. Thomas reported the garden plots will be located west of Johns Avenue on National Park property. Use of the ground was given on a year to year basis. There will be no fee for a plot. On April 23rd at 7:30 PM a public meeting will be held in the West Street Office of the Gettysburg National Bank. Weather permitting the plots will be ready between April 15th and 30th.

Mrs. Daniels reported the list of approved trees not yet complete.

Mr. Sterner's report:

1. New police car has been ordered - cost \$10,499.89
2. Four Square Church requested parking be removed from in front of their property on West Middle Street. Safety Committee directed to study.
3. Recommended the employment of a mechanic for Borough vehicles and equipment. Finance and Highway Committees to consider.
4. Survey revealed deplorable condition at a junkyard in south end of town.

Moved Mr. Hartzell seconded Mr. Schmitt the junkyard owner be notified that Council ordered the abatement of the nuisance by removal of the abandoned and/or junked automobiles. Motion carried.

Moved Mr. Delzingaro seconded Mr. Hartzell a letter be sent the Zoning Hearing Board recommending they favorably consider the variances requested for the Stanton Legion and Pape Building on corner of West High and South Franklin Streets. Motion carried.

Moved Mr. Schmitt seconded Mr. Witt the Mayor be in charge of observing Local Government Day. Motion carried.

Moved Mr. Dezlingaro seconded Mr. Schmitt the list of names proposed by G. H. Harris Associates for exoneration be approved. Motion carried.

Mayor's report:

1. Daffodil Parade will be held March 24, 1984.
2. He had sent a letter to the Mayor of Gadyach.
3. Also he had issued a proclamation for Girl Scout Week - March 11 thru March 17, 1984.

Moved Mr. Ditzler seconded Mr. Hartzell the reports of the Mayor, Chief of Police, Treasurer, Code Enforcement Officer and Gettysburg Fire Company be approved. Motion carried.

Moved Mr. Ditzler seconded Mr. Schmitt beginning with the April meeting following the prayer the pledge of allegiance will be recited. Motion carried.

Moved Mr. Ditzler seconded Mr. Cluck the minutes of HARB be approved. Motion carried.

Mr. Oyler directed to have sample ordinance with new meter rates ready for study at the April meeting.

A lengthy discussion re the question presented by Attorney Teeter rel to Certificate of Occupancy for student housing resulted in Council taking no action.

Moved and seconded meeting adjourn at 10:25 PM. Motion carried.

RESOLUTION

FOR ADDITIONAL STREET LIGHTING

WHEREAS, a contract was entered into between the Borough of Gettysburg, County of Adams and Metropolitan Edison Company on October 1, 1983 (date) whereby Company shall furnish lighting; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary and proper that additional lighting should be installed and maintained for the service, accommodation, convenience and safety of the public;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Borough of Gettysburg, pursuant to the provisions and terms of the Company's applicable Rate Schedules and Riders, and the rules and regulations now on file and such rules and regulations, Rate Schedules and Riders hereafter filed from time to time and in effect with the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission (Tariff), does hereby order and direct Metropolitan Edison Company to furnish additional lighting consisting of

Install 1 - 8550 Lumen 100 Watt High Pressure Sodium Street Light  
to be located at Legeon Alley west on Pole # 621 GB

and hereby agrees to pay to Metropolitan Edison Company for such additional lighting at the rates provided in the Tariff.
