Moved Mr. Little seconded Mr. Heflin that the Borough advertise for bids for road building materials and equipment rental. Bids to be opened at March meeting. Motion carried.

Moved Mr. Shealer seconded Mr. Ditzler that a resolution be adopted to install a street light in the alley to the rear of 350 York Street. Motion carried.

Mr. Kuhn announced the Borough will receive \$4,683.00 County-aid for 1975.

Moved Mr. Weikert seconded Mr. Thomas that application be made for the County-aid which will be used in conjunction with the Liquid Fuel tax money in the road building program for 1975. Motion carried.
