

President Hull presided at the August meeting of Council that was attended by the following Councilmen: Messrs. Musselman, Weikert, Heflin, Rebert, Thomas, Little, Shealer and Ditzler.

The minutes of the previous meeting were approved as read.

Mr. J. R. Hershey appeared to inform Council of possible problems should the School District place the proposed drainage pipe and fill the area east of the Senior High School Building. Following the ensuing discussion the following motion was made: Moved Mr. Thomas seconded Mr. Little that the School District be instructed to place the equivalent of two 6 ft diameter drain pipes or 56 square feet of total drainage from the existing 40 square feet of culvert to the existing 6 ft diameter pipe, to increase the existing 6 ft pipe to the equivalent of 56 square feet. Motion carried.

Mayor Lightner announced Adams Sanitation Company had applied for a Garbage License and that it would be issued in the near future.

Safety Committee to study the feasibility of placing 4-way stop signs at the Springs Avenue-Howard Avenue intersection.

Moved Mr. Musselman seconded Mr. Rebert that Pfc Laughman be promoted to Corporal on probationary basis, effective the first pay period in August. (Aug. 10th). Motion carried.

Moved Mr. Musselman seconded Mr. Ditzler that an ordinance be drawn to ban commercial vehicles from parking on the west side of South Washington Street from the Hospital entrance south to Steinwehr Avenue. Motion carried.

Moved Mr. Rebert seconded Mr. Thomas that a letter be sent Rep. Cole urging him to support passage of Senate Bill 420 (P.N.983) which would authorize the court to impose costs upon the defendant to cover the cost of having police officers testify in court. The costs to be returned to the municipalities. Motion carried.

Mr. Thomas reported the increased lighting on York Street has improved visibility near the Fire House.

Mr. Ditzler expressed his concern for the hazards created by bicycle violators.

Moved Mr. Weikert seconded Mr. Shealer all approved bills and payrolls be paid. Motion carried.

President Hull reminded Council of the Public Hearing on the Zoning Ordinance to be held in the Court House, August 18, 1975 at 8 P.M.

Mr. Heflin reported Charles Kerrigan has been engaged to paint the Municipal Building.

After Mr. Kuhn reported the estimated cost of rebuilding the snow loader the Highway Committee was directed to make a cost study of renting equipment for snow removal vs the cost of purchasing another loader.

Moved Mr. Little seconded Mr. Weikert the ordinance ordaining West Railroad Street be adopted. Motion carried.

Moved Mr. Thomas seconded Mr. Weikert that permits be issued to the following as recommended by the Gettysburg Historical District Architectural Review Board: Wolfe's Restaurant (sign); Pa. Department of Health (sign); Elks Lodge (renovations to former Warren Garage); Hartman's Law Office (sign); Adams County Farmers Market

(sign); Jacqueline Decor (sign). Motion carried.

Moved Mr. Weikert seconded Mr. Heflin the Historical Review Board's recommendation to reject the application of Gettysburg Shoe Company for a sign and of Thomas McKinney to enclose a proch be sustained. Motion carried.

Moved Mr. Thomas seconded Mr. Weikert that the request for a building permit for the Court House be tabled until more information is received. Motion carried.

Moved and seconded the reports of the Mayor, Treasurer, Police Chief, Fire Marshall and the Historical Review Board be accepted. Motion carried.

President Hull appointed the Safety Committee of Council to represent the Borough at the meetings held periodically by the Recreation Board Officials and the Fire Department Officials.

Moved and seconded meeting adjourn. Motion carried.
