

## Minutes of March 14, 1977 Meeting

Vice President Shealer presided at the March meeting of Council. The meeting convened at 8 P.M. with the following councilmen attending: Messrs. Heflin, Rudisill, Little, Miller, Ditzler, Delzingaro and Rebert.

The minutes of the February meeting were approved as read.

Mrs. John Earnst, speaker for a committee from H.G.-A.C., Inc. presented plans for a walking tour of the Historic District. The tentative plans specify small groups with a guide. In the interest of safety they will cross the intersections at the traffic lights. Council agreed it would have no opposition to the project as long as the safety of all is given prime consideration.

Moved Mr. Heflin seconded Mr. Rudisill that the bid of Wolf Farm Supply for a Kubota L-225 tractor at a cost of \$2,700 with trade-in be accepted. Motion carried.

Allen Larson, chairman of Gettysburg Municipal Authority brought Council up to date on the progress of the new sewage facilities. He estimated 1981 as the earliest the plant could be in operation. Mr. Larson also expressed gratitude for help provided by the Borough during the emergencies of the past winter.

Highway Committee to consider resurfacing Constitution Avenue and make recommendations at the April meeting.

Moved Mr. Rebert seconded Mr. Delzingaro that all approved bills and payrolls be paid. Motion carried.

Moved Mr. Rebert seconded Mr. Delzingaro that the H.G.-A.C. Inc. contribution be paid in quarterly installments beginning with March. Motion carried.

A resolution proposed by Finance Chairman, Mr. Rebert that the \$12,837.00 received under the Anti-Recession Title II be allocated for purchase of Police Radio Equipment and for the education of the officers on the force who have not as yet attended the Police Academy was seconded by Mr. Heflin and was unanimously approved by Borough Council.

A resolution proposed by Mr. Rebert that 90% of all funds received from Revenue Sharing grants for the calendar year 1977 be used to underwrite a portion of the Police budget for 1977 was seconded by Mr. Heflin and approved by Council with no dissenting votes.

Mr. Miller reported storm sewers on North Washington Street and Victor Street had been completed. Repairs to the walls of the Tiber at Bream's Shopping Center and Gettysburg Silk Mill have been completed. The work on the Tiber was paid for with funds from Flood Disaster Relief grant.

Moved Mr. Miller seconded Mr. Little that the Highway Department proceed placing storm sewers according to priorities established by Sewer Committee. Motion carried.

Moved Mr. Ditzler seconded Mr. Miller the Borough advertise for bids for 1977 Police car. Specs to be same as last year. Motion carried.

At Mr. Heflin's recommendation the Property Committee directed to study the feasibility of having a tank and pump installed to dispense diesel fuel.

Moved Mr. Heflin seconded Mr. Miller the Borough hold a Spring Clean-up. Borough Manager to advertise dates. There will be one trip over town with no call backs. Motion carried by majority vote. Mr. Delzingaro dissenting.

Moved Mr. Ditzler seconded Mr. Rudisill that Council adopt a resolution to use County-aid in the amount of \$4,688.85 in conjunction with State Liquid Fuel Funds for use in road maintenance for 1977. Motion carried.

Moved Mr. Ditzler seconded Mr. Delzingaro that the Borough adopt the ordinance placing 15 minute meters on the north side of East High Street by the Post Office. Motion carried.

Moved Mr. Rebert seconded Mr. Little that the contract for 1977 with J. R. Hershey be approved. Motion carried.

Moved Mr. Rebert seconded Mr. Ditzler the \$300.00 allocated in the '77 budget for the Gettysburg Civic Chorus be paid as requested. Motion carried.

Moved Mr. Ditzler seconded Mr. Delzingaro the reports of the Mayor, Treasurer and Police Chief be accepted. Motion carried.

Moved Mr. Delzingaro seconded Mr. Heflin the report of H.A.R.B. be approved except for the application of Kathryn Schultz for an addition to a building at 145 Baltimore Street. Mrs. Schultz will be advised to present sketch before action will be taken. Motion carried.

Moved Mr. Little seconded Mr. Heflin the meeting adjourn. Motion carried.
