

MINUTES OF MEETING APRIL 13, 1981

The meeting was called to order at 7:30 PM by President Shealer. The following Councilmen attended: Messrs Ditzler, Heflin, Miller, Witt, Cluck, Madsen, Delzingaro and Swope.

The minutes were approved as read.

Mayor Lightner reported the Chamber of Commerce had requested Council's approval to conduct a Farmer's Market on Lincoln Square one Saturday each month, June thru October. They would place coins in the meters from 8 to 5.

Moved Mr. Swope seconded Mr. Madsen Council grant the Chamber of Commerce permission to conduct a Farmer's Market on Lincoln Square one Saturday each month-dates to be determined by the Mayor and the Chamber. Motion carried.

Moved Mr. Heflin seconded Mr. Madsen the sign proposal for Centennial General Store, Steinwehr Avenue be approved as HARB recommended and a certificate of appropriateness issued. Motion carried.

Moved Mr. Ditzler seconded Mr. Heflin the application of Don Nunemaker to commercialize a building on South Washington Street be tabled until plans are available for review. Motion carried.

Moved Mr. Swope seconded Mr. Madsen the application of Dorothy Adams to place siding on her building be approved as HARB recommended and a certificate of appropriateness issued. Motion carried.

The application of John Hartman to place aluminum siding on Jenny Wade Birthplace was tabled for clarification.

Moved Mr. Heflin seconded Mr. Ditzler Council accept the HARB minutes except the Nunemaker and Hartman sections. Motion carried.

Moved Mr. Heflin seconded Mr. Ditzler the Manager be authorized to submit application for County-aid. Money to be incorporated in the Highway-aid Fund for road building projects. Motion carried.

Moved Mr. Miller seconded Mr. Delzingaro the meter north of the driveway to Heritage Motor Lodge be removed. Motion carried.

Moved Mr. Miller seconded Mr. Cluck "Children at Play" signs be erected at the following locations-West Street & West High; Breckenridge & Franklin; South Washington & West High; Long Lane at Rec Park Parking lots. Motion carried.

Mr. Miller announced the Safety Committee is still studying the mutual aid agreement for the Cumberland Township and Borough Police Departments.

Moved Mr. Cluck seconded Mr. Ditzler Scott Purdy be appointed to fill the unexpired term of Darlene Hardman on the Recreation Board. Term to expire September 1983. Motion carried.

Moved Mr. Cluck seconded Mr. Ditzler Joel Hill be appointed to a five year term on the Board of Appeals for Building. Motion carried.

.. Mr. Witt will attend Recreation Board April meeting in Mr. Delzingaro's absence.

Moved Mr. Delzingaro seconded Mr. Madsen the proposed amendment to the Sign Ordinance be advertised for adoption at May meeting. Motion carried.

Moved Mr. Delzingaro seconded Mr. Heflin an ordinance be drawn and advertised to repeal the Self-service gasoline station ordinance. Motion carried.

Moved Mr. Swope seconded Mr. Madsen the Manager advertise for bids to purchase a backhoe. Bids to be on a straight sale and trade in basis. Present backhoe to be either traded or sold to highest bidder. Motion carried.

Mr. Swope asked the reporter for some publicity on the lack of courtesy of many motorists for pedestrians crossing the streets in the cross walk areas.

Mr. Swope reported the scramblers that have been installed in the police vehicles are not covered by insurance. Cost of insurance - \$60.00 per year.

Mr. Swope reported a meeting of the Mayor, Safety Committee, Chief of Police and the Manager and Assistant Manager to be held on April 27, 1981 at 7 PM.

Moved Mr. Ditzler seconded Mr. Madsen all approved bills (\$31,270.21) and pay-rolls be paid. Motion carried.

Mr. Sterner reported the Solicitor has filed a suit in assumpsit against the Retreat, also criminal charges have been filed with the magistrate.

Mr. Sterner reported Spring Clean-up has been completed.

Mr. Lawver reported 1981 tree trimming project is complete but there is still one case pending from 1980 project.

Mr. Shealer directed Sewer Committee to study the Princess Street-McMillan Street area rel to placing storm sewer in that region.

Mr. Shealer commented on complaints received rel to dogs not being on a leash.

Moved Mr. Heflin seconded Mr. Madsen the proposed exoneration list, as presented by G. H. Harris Associates, be rejected. Motion carried.

Moved Mr. Ditzler seconded Mr. Swope the reports of the Mayor, Police Chief and Treasurer be accepted. Motion carried.

Moved Mr. Ditzler seconded Mr. Heflin the reports of the Fire Company, Fire Marshall and Code Enforcement Officer be accepted. Motion carried.

President Shealer directed the Property Committee prepare specs for a new dump truck. Bids to be accepted later this year.

Moved and seconded meeting adjourn at 8:55 PM. Motion carried.
