

MINUTES OF MEETING - JULY 13, 1981

President Shealer called the meeting to order at 7:30 PM with the following Councilmen attending: Messrs. Heflin, Miller, Cluck, Delzingaro, Swope, Madsen, Witt, and Ditzler.

The minutes were approved as read.

Moved Mr. Madsen seconded Mr. Delzingaro Council approve the recommendations of the Rec Board to enable the Optimist Club to erect a band shell at the northwest corner of the park. Motion carried.

Moved Mr. Swope seconded Mr. Madsen Council accept the bid of Worley Equipment to purchase a John Deere 310A backhoe with trade in for \$20,935.00 (six interest free payments of \$840.00 leaving a balance due on Jan. 1, 1982 of \$15,895.00). Motion carried.

Moved Mr. Madsen seconded Mr. Heflin Council reject the proposed site (Circle) for Lincoln bust as recommended by HARB on basis of potential safety hazard created by persons crossing traffic to view statue. Motion carried by majority vote - Mr. Delzingaro dissenting.

Moved Mr. Heflin seconded Mr. Cluck Council approve the recommendation of HARB and issue a certificate of appropriateness to Joseph Pittinger, 229 Baltimore Street for placement of aluminum siding on north side of his property. Motion carried.

Moved Mr. Ditzler seconded Mr. Cluck the application of Kenneth Foust to place aluminum siding on building at 152 West Middle Street be approved as HARB recommended and a certificate of appropriateness issued. Motion carried.

Moved Mr. Ditzler seconded Mr. Cluck the recommendation of HARB be approved to enable Charles Bender, Jr. to install new window sash on his building on Lincoln Square. A certificate of appropriateness to be issued. Motion carried.

Moved Mr. Heflin seconded Mr. Madsen the application of Loring Schultz be approved as HARB recommended and a certificate of appropriateness issued. Motion carried by majority vote, Mr. Witt dissenting.

Moved Mr. Madsen seconded Mr. Delzingaro the proposal of Triangle Trading Company to reletter an approved sign (Cathcart Bros.) be approved by Council. Motion carried.

Moved Mr. Heflin seconded Mr. Madsen Council accept HARB minutes. Motion carried.

Mr. Madsen reported receiving a complaint from a Carlisle Street resident rel to increased truck traffic and loud noises connected therewith.

Mr. Ditzler reported the Finance Committee felt it cannot make an additional contribution to the Library.

Moved Mr. Ditzler seconded Mr. Madsen the salary of the Code Enforcement Officer be increased to \$12,600 effective July 1, 1981. Motion defeated - 3 ayes Swope, Madsen, Ditzler; 5 nays Delzingaro, Witt, Miller, Heflin and Cluck.

Moved Mr. Ditzler seconded Mr. Heflin all approved bills (\$81,611.97) and payrolls be paid. Motion carried.

Mr. Heflin reported Penn Dot is working on State Streets within the Borough to repair the bumps. Highway crew to paint lines in lieu of placing tape this year.

Moved Mr. Miller seconded Mr. Swope the Queen Street-Sunset Avenue & King Street Sunset Avenue intersections be made 4-way stop intersections; the "Yield" sign on Johns Avenue where it intersects with Highland Avenue be replaced with a "stop" sign. Motion carried.

Mr. Miller reported Safety Committee still working on the Wade Avenue request.

Mr. Cluck reported the proposed light on North Franklin Street has been tabled for the present.

Moved Mr. Cluck seconded Mr. Heflin Reece Swatsworth be appointed to five year term on the Gettysburg Area Industrial Development Authority. Motion carried.

Mr. Sterner's report: 1. Receipt of a check in the amount of \$120.00 for January 1980 Amusement Tax for the Retreat as per hearing findings before Magistrate Weaver.

2. A letter received from the Maryland Comptroller re deduction of an earned income tax from Maryland residents had been turned over to Mr. Oyler who had replied to it.

3. Mr. Hershey will be working on Winebrenner Run this week.

4. The new police car has been delivered - the 1978 Chevrolet Impala will be advertised for sale to highest bidder, bids to be opened at August meeting.

5. The Borough has purchased a used 1976 International Truck.

Sewer and Highway Committees to study proposed drainage project near Constitution Avenue.

Safety Committee to study proposal of "The Conflict" rel to parking on Steinwehr Avenue.

Chief Wells reported Pauline Carr has resigned, effective July 23, 1981.

Following a thirty minute executive session motion made by Mr. Delzingaro seconded Mr. Heflin Patrolman H. Eugene Fones be reinstated with back pay. Motion carried by majority vote 6 ayes-Messrs. Heflin, Miller, Cluck, Delzingaro, Witt and Swope; 1 nay - Mr. Madsen; Mr. Ditzler abstaining.


Mr. Lawver speaking as a taxpayer voiced his concern that a recent article in the Gettysburg Times was misleading re the financial status of the Borough but if the grant applied for by the Police Department is received the Borough's share of \$28,000 would mean an increase of 2 mills in taxes. He reported being approached by residents who are concerned about the increase in taxes.

Moved Mr. Ditzler seconded Mr. Cluck the reports of the Mayor, Police Chief, Treasurer and Code Enforcement Officer be accepted. Motion carried.

Moved Mr. Miller seconded Mr. Ditzler Council grant permission to enable PFC Gantz to attend Smith & Wesson Armor School in Hartford, Connecticut August 23rd thru September 4th. Boro to pay for transportation, lodging, meals and a tool kit needed for the course. Motion carried.

Moved and seconded meeting adjourn at 9:15 P.M. Motion carried.
