

MINUTES OF MEETING HELD SEPT. 14, 1981

The September meeting of Council was called to order at 7:30 PM by President Shealer with the following Councilmen in attendance: Messrs. Swope, Madsen, Witt, Ditzler, Heflin, Miller, Cluck and Delzingaro.

The minutes were approved as corrected.

Moved Mr. Heflin seconded Mr. Madsen the Borough adopt the Resolution (Final Environmental Impact Statement, Gettysburg Area Wastewater Treatment Facilities as prepared by the United States Environmental Protection Agency, Region III) to enable the Gettysburg Municipal Authority to apply for funds. Motion carried.

Moved Mr. Delzingaro seconded Mr. Heflin the proposed ordinance enabling GMA to provide service to resident of Straban Township along Route 30 from Borough line east to Route 15 By-Pass Interchange be advertised for adoption at October meeting. Motion carried.

William Monahan complimented Mr. Sterner and Mr. Lawver for their efforts in getting a Carlisle Street property owner to clean-up his premises.

Three residents from Breckenridge Village appeared to seek additional lighting at the rear of their properties. Utility Committee to check situation and report at October meeting.

Moved Mr. Madsen seconded Mr. Delzingaro Council approve the proposed Chamber of Commerce Parking Lot provided the Chamber guarantees full payment of construction costs within a four year period. Motion carried.

Barry Hallett presented the 1982 Fire Department Budget.

Mayor Lightner reported children are crawling in culvert at intersection of Court Alley and Mayor Alley and playing in the tunnel. The Mayor also reported receipt of a request of Postmaster Golya to have meters removed by the post office building and erect signs for free parking for post office patrons.

Moved Mr. Delzingaro seconded Mr. Cluck the Gettysburg Fire Department be granted permission to hold Fire Prevention Program on Lincoln Square, October 5th from 7 to 9 P.M. providing they assist with traffic control. Motion carried.

Moved Mr. Ditzler seconded Mr. Cluck the ordinance making Wade Avenue a one-way street be adopted. Motion carried.

Moved Mr. Delzingaro Council adopt the ordinance to make Kuhn Alley one-way west from South Washington Street to Warner Alley. Lacking a second the motion died.

Mr. Delzingaro presented the following for Council's consideration:

1. Increase application fee for a Zoning Hearing.
2. Consider adoption of BOCA Code (Building, Fire, Electrical, Plumbing, Mechanical, and Property Maintenance.
3. Could Rec park Board charge fees for events held in Band Shell should occasion arise that would mandate this?

Council directed Ordinance Committee to pursue feasibility of adoption of BOCA Code. Council agreed it has no objection to the concept of charging fees for certain events held at the Band Shell.

Moved Mr. Cluck seconded Mr. Heflin Robert Kenworthy and Barbara Wickerham be re-appointed to five year terms on Recreation Board and Robert Crouthamel be appointed to fill the vacancy created by the resignation of Scott Purdy. Term to expire September 1983. Motion carried.

Moved Mr. Miller seconded Mr. Madsen Council hire two police at this time and a third person at a later date. Warren Sheppard to begin duties September 15, Cytha Grissom on September 16. Motion carried.

Mr. Heflin reported the block of South Washington Street between West Middle and West High Streets to be paved next week.

Mr. Heflin also reported the final meeting of the Advisory Committee (GMA) will be held September 24th and a public meeting in Adams County Courthouse on September 29th.

Moved Mr. Swope seconded Mr. Madsen the engine be removed from Truck #5 (1964 Ford) and installed in Truck #3 (1967 Ford). Truck #5 to be advertised for sale after transition completed. Motion carried.

Mr. Swope reported the Trinity United Church of Christ will probably decide in the near future whether or not they will lease their parking area for a public facility.

It was decided to have Mr. Sterner contact the principal of Meade School re: having west bound school buses stay back from white line in the interest of the students safety at red light on Chambersburg Street as recommended by Mr. Madsen.

Moved Mr. Witt seconded Mr. Cluck the Borough Manager be authorized to begin leaf collection when that service is needed. Motion carried.

Moved Mr. Ditzler seconded Mr. Swope all approved bills (\$68,172.23) and payrolls be paid. Motion carried.

Richard Naugle approached Council about enacting an ordinance against noise pollution. During the discussion Mr. Swope suggested perhaps the present noise ordinance should be updated as well as have the Chief of Police contact College authorities. Mr. Witt volunteered to meet with the Inter-Fraternity Council to seek their cooperation in finding an amicable solution to the noise and other problems.

Borough Manager's report:

1. During the paving of Gettysburg Street the curb of Thomas Foss, 607 Fairview Avenue was damaged - Borough will repair.
2. Letter received from Penn Dot re renewal of permit for traffic signal at York-Hanover and Liberty Street intersection. Council agreed permit should be renewed.
3. Drainage problems along railroad tracks at Lincoln Diner, J. C. Cleaners and Lumber Yard. Council authorized Mr. Sterner to contact Western Maryland for permission to enter their property to work on storm sewer.
4. Musselman Company has requested cars refrain from parking near their building on North Franklin Street as it hinders their trucks in getting to loading dock. Safety Committee to investigate.

Moved Mr. Heflin seconded Mr. Cluck the Code Enforcement Officer be authorized to enforce the garbage removal ordinance. Motion carried.

Moved Mr. Swope seconded Mr. Ditzler Council accept with regret the resignation of Mr. Delzingaro effective September 17, 1981 as he will be moving to the first ward. Motion carried.

Moved Mr. Ditzler that Donald Reimer be appointed effective September 17th as Third Ward Councilman. Term to expire December 31, 1981. Lacking a second the motion died.

Moved Mr. Ditzler seconded Mr. Cluck the reports of the Mayor, Chief of Police, Code Enforcement Officer, Treasurer and Fire Company be accepted. Motion carried.

Moved Mr. Delzingaro seconded Mr. Heflin a certificate of appropriateness be issued as recommended by HARB for sign proposal of H.G.-A.C. Inc. Motion carried.

Moved Mr. Ditzler seconded Mr. Heflin the proposal to place aluminum siding on front of house by Charles Redding be approved as HARB recommended and a certificate of appropriateness issued. Motion carried.

Moved Mr. Delzingaro seconded Mr. Heflin Council approve the application of Loretta Fick "Gallery 30" for installation of awning at 30 York Street as HARB recommended and a certificate of appropriateness issued. Motion carried.

Moved Mr. Heflin seconded Mr. Cluck the HARB minutes be accepted. Motion carried.

President Shealer announced an executive meeting rel to personnel matters would be held following adjournment.

Moved and seconded meeting adjourn at 9:35 PM. Motion carried.
