

MINUTES OF MEETING HELD MARCH 8, 1982

President Shealer called the meeting to order at 7:30 PM with the following members of Council attending: Heflin, Miller, Cluck, Romero, Daniels, Madsen, Witt and Ditzler.

The February Council minutes and the minutes of the Public Hearing held February 25, 1982 were approved as read.

President Shealer, as Acting Mayor in Mayor Lightner's absence, reported receipt of a letter from Chief Potter recommending promotions for PFC Gantz and PFC Wright to the rank of Corporal.

Moved Mr. Miller seconded Mr. Cluck Frederick A. Gantz be promoted to the rank of Corporal effective March 14, 1982. Cpl Gantz will be assigned to the Criminal Investigating Division. Motion carried.

Moved Mr. Miller seconded Mr. Cluck Dennis F. Wright be promoted to the rank of Corporal effective March 28, 1982. Cpl Wright will remain in the traffic and law enforcement division. Motion carried.

Moved Mr. Cluck seconded Mr. Madsen Council adopt the ordinance authorizing the Police Department to use the Speed Check device. Motion carried.

Mrs. Romero reported Adams Electric Cooperative and Metropolitan Edison Company will replace four poles at the Recreation Park at no cost to the Borough. The poles to be erected for lighting during evening activities.

Mrs. Romero commented on debris in gutters. Was informed streets will be cleaned as work schedules and weather permit.

Mr. Madsen reported committee responsible for Fahnestock Building still hopeful of getting funds for renovations.

On Mr. Madsen's recommendation the Safety Committee was directed to study Wade Avenue rel to returning it to two way traffic.

Moved Mr. Witt seconded Mr. Cluck Council conduct a Spring Cleanup. Dates to be set and advertised by Borough Manager. Motion carried.

Moved Mr. Witt seconded Mr. Madsen Council pass a resolution to request our state and federal legislators to urge passage of resolutions by their respective bodies to urge President Reagan to abandon the plan to build 17,000 additional nuclear weapons. Motion carried.

Moved Mr. Ditzler seconded Mr. Heflin all approved bills (\$36,955.73) and payrolls be paid. Motion carried.

As a result of a change by the County Tax Authorities the Borough will now have to determine whether or not an assessment, as listed on the original duplicate, should be revised. President Shealer directed these cases be studied by the Finance Committee and bring recommendations to Council for action.

Moved Mr. Ditzler seconded Mr. Madsen the list of exonerations as presented by G. H. Harris not be approved in its entirety. 8 names to be resubmitted for further attempts to collect. The other eleven names to be exonerated. Motion carried. (Approved list to be placed in Minute Book).

The Ordinance Committee directed to study the Comprehensive Plan and make recommendations to Council rel to its adoption or rejection.

The Highway and Safety Committees directed to study request for establishment of Snow Emergency Route on West Lincoln Avenue from Carlisle Street west to College Avenue.

Mr. Sterner reported a gas leak at rear of this building had been repaired; also the new parking lot is nearly complete.

Moved Mr. Madsen seconded Mr. Witt Mr. Sterner be authorized to purchase a used Sandblaster, cost not to exceed \$190.00. Motion carried.

Moved Mr. Madsen seconded Mr. Heflin the Treasurer pay \$2,031.00 to Provident Mutual to cover administrative expenses, due to error detected in audit by Auditor General's Office. Motion carried.

Mr. Sterner reported a meeting has been scheduled with Penn Dot Officials re: to grant for street resurfacing.


Moved Mr. Heflin seconded Mr. Cluck Council approve the Fire Marshall's report. Motion carried.
