

MINUTES OF APRIL 12, 1982

President Shealer called the April meeting of Council to order at 7:30 PM with the following members of Council present: Heflin, Miller, Cluck, Romero, Daniels, Madsen, Witt and Ditzler.

The minutes of the regular March meeting and of the Special meeting held March 18th were approved as read.

President Shealer read a Resolution commemorating Mayor Lightner. Motion by Mr. Ditzler seconded Mr. Cluck Council adopt the resolution and present same to Mrs. Lightner. Motion carried. (Copy placed in Minute Book)

President Shealer welcomed Mayor Weikert who thanked Council for their confidence in appointing him to fill the vacancy.

Thomas Carr, Fire Chief, recommended Council investigate possibility of adopting an ordinance that would prohibit the railroads from placing cars containing hazardous materials on sidings for extended periods of time. Ordinance Committee to confer with Attorney Oyler re to the matter.

Mayor Weikert's report to Council included:

1. Retail Merchants request use of 4 quadrants of Lincoln Square to hold Arts & Crafts Show June 19, 1982 - 8AM to 5 PM.

2. Walk for Peace Organization request permission to use sidewalks on May 8, 1982--Walk from National Cemetery to Peace Light Memorial.

3. The State Emergency Management Agency needs a recommendation from Council to fill vacancy created by the death of Mayor Lightner. Mayor Weikert recommended Council consider submitting Mr. Lawver's name for the post.

4. Chief Potter, Safety Committee and Mayor concur on recommendation that Thomas Barkdoll be promoted to PFC, effective April 14, 1982.

5. Grand Lodge of Penna. plan to hold a parade on June 26, 1982. Chief Potter, Mayor, Mr. Sterner and others have met with Committee re details.

Moved Mr. Madsen seconded Mr. Cluck Council grant Retail Merchants permission to hold Arts & Craft Show on June 19, 1982. Meters to be covered on all four quadrants. Motion carried.

Moved Mr. Cluck seconded Mrs. Daniels approval be given the Walk for Peace Organization as per their request. Motion carried.

Moved Mr. Madsen seconded Mr. Cluck Council submit the name of John D. Lawver, Jr. to the State Emergency Management Agency for Borough Coordinator. Motion carried.

Moved Mr. Ditzler seconded Mr. Cluck Council approve Masonic parade scheduled for June 26, 1982. Motion carried.

Moved Mrs. Daniels seconded Mr. Romero Council approve request to close West High Street between South Washington Street and South Franklin Street on May 1st from noon to 5 PM for Street Fair. Motion carried.

Mrs. Daniels relayed to Council the concern of HARB re trees in Circle, was informed the Borough would take charge of the project.

Moved Mrs. Daniels seconded Mr. Cluck Warren Stouck be appointed to a 5 yr term on Board of Appeals for Building. Motion carried.

Moved Mr. Ditzler seconded Mr. Heflin all approved bills (\$38,459.97) and pay-



rolls be paid. Motion carried.

Moved Mr. Ditzler seconded Mr. Heflin that Anne L. Faber be given blanket approval to make revisions and deletions to the tax duplicate as instructed by County Assessing Office. Motion carried.

Moved Mr. Heflin seconded Mr. Madsen the bid of American Tank & Culvert Company for corrugated pipe be accepted at the following prices: 29"x18" @ 7.94; 22"x13" @ 6.27. Motion carried.

Moved Mr. Heflin seconded Mr. Ditzler the Highway Committee proceed with original plans for Highway-aid work, reason being possible unavailability or delay in receiving Federal Urban Funds. Rel to Federal Urban Program if entire project appears debatable process part that looks certain. Property owners needing sidewalk or curb work to be notified to have work completed prior to beginning street work. Motion carried.

Moved Mr. Miller seconded Mr. Cluck Thomas Barkdoll be promoted to PFC effective April 14, 1982. Motion carried.

Moved Mr. Miller seconded Mr. Witt Council approve recommendation of 52 signers of the Petition to have Wade Avenue remain as is (one way travel east). Motion carried by majority vote, Mrs. Daniels and Mr. Madsen dissenting.

Moved Mr. Cluck seconded Mr. Heflin the driveway ordinance be advertised for adoption at May meeting. Motion carried.

Mrs. Romero questioned what could be done about the young people who gather on the AME Zion Church property after curfew and make noise. Was informed that if the Church Council sends a letter to the Police Chief authorizing the department to police area the condition should be corrected.

Mr. Sterner's report:

1. Spring Cleanup to begin April 19th
2. Request from Harbr nts for a parking space in their lot for tenant with handicapped child. Council agreed to grant request on trial basis.
3. Trinity Church lot now operating
4. Recommend removal of 10 hr meters on East High Street plus first 4 West High Street. Replace with 2 hr meters. Safety Committee to study.
5. New parking lot and Roth Alley area quite dark - a street light needed badly.

Moved Mr. Madsen seconded Mr. Ditzler a street light be erected in Roth Alley - the Borough to pay electricity. Motion carried.

Mr. Lawver reported having sent a bill for cleanup of a health hazard-to date has not been reimbursed. Attorney Oyler to contact attorney in charge of the property.

President Shealer designated Mrs Daniels (Boards and Commissions) to present name of an eligible elector to serve as Chairman of Vacancy Board at the May meeting. Vacancy Board comprised of all council members plus an eligible elector.

Moved Mr. Ditzler seconded Mr. Cluck Council accept the reports of the Mayor, Police Chief, Treasurer and Code Enforcement Officer. Motion carried.

Moved Mr. Ditzler seconded Mr. Madsen the recommendation of HARB be approved for proposal of American Legion to replace glass panels. A certificate of appropriateness to be issued. Motion carried.

APRIL 12, 1982 (cont'd)

Moved Mr. Ditzler seconded Mr. Cluck the proposal of Robert Crouthamel to remove a small barn at rear of 33 East Middle Street be approved as HARB recommended and a certificate of appropriateness issued. Motion carried.

Moved Mr. Ditzler seconded Mr. Heflin Council accept HARB Minutes. Motion carried.

Moved Mr. Cluck seconded Mr. Heflin the reports of the Fire Department for January and February be accepted. Motion carried.

Utility Committee directed to study North Franklin Street rel to need for an additional street light.

Moved and seconded meeting adjourn at 9:20 PM. Motion carried.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Borough of Gettysburg, pursuant to the provisions and terms of the Company's applicable Rate Schedules and Riders, and the rules and regulations now on file and such rules and regulations, Rate Schedules and Riders hereafter filed from time to time and in effect with the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission (Tariff), does hereby order and direct Metropolitan Edison Company to furnish additional lighting consisting of
