

MINUTES OF MEETING - MAY 10, 1982

President Shealer called the May meeting to order at 7:30 PM with the following Council members in attendance: Romero, Cluck, Miller, Heflin, Ditzler, Witt, Madsen and Daniels.

The minutes of the April meeting were approved as read.

Ralph Arendt from Donut Delight explained the placing of doughnuts across the front of the building as decorative not advertising symbols as had been determined by Mr. Lawver. Attorney Oyler to study ordinance and make a decision.

A group of Concerned Parents approached Council for support and/or any other help they can give in the fight against Drug & Alcohol related problems.

Mayor Weikert reported vehicles park on yellow line area on Baltimore Street creating problems for trucks and buses entering from West Middle Street. The present sign to be replaced with "NO STOPPING OR STANDING".

Mayor reported he had been contacted rel to Fahnstock Building--Committee still hopeful of obtaining funds for renovations.

Moved Mr. Heflin seconded Mr. Madsen the Borough apply the County-aid in the amount of \$4,223.40 to Highway-aid projects. Motion carried.

Mr. Heflin reported curb and sidewalk notices have been sent. (Along streets where work will be done the year).

Council to consider until next month Mr. Heflin's recommendation that all future employees be required to move into Borough if not residents when employed.

Moved Mr. Miller seconded Mr. Cluck the parking meter ordinance be amended to remove ten hour meters on East High Street and east of 1st alley on West High Street. To be replaced with 2 hr meters. Ordinance to be advertised and adopted at June meeting. Motion carried.

Mr. Cluck reported PUC had been contacted rel railroads cars containing hazardous materials. Mr. Lawver reported PUC had contacted him and a copy of the letter sent to Tailroad Company would be forth coming to inform Borough of PUC action in the matter.

Mrs. Romero presented Chief Potter with a letter from AME Zion Church authorizing police to disband groups who congregate on Church property.

Moved Mr. Romero seconded Mr. Miller a street light be erected at end of North Franklin Street. Motion carried.

Moved Mrs. Daniels seconded Mr. Heflin Council appoint Walter Lane to serve as Chairman of Vacancy Board. Term to expire 1st Monday in January 1984. Motion carried.

Moved Mrs. Daniels seconded Mr. Cluck Dr. Robert Lefever be appointed to a six year term on Civil Service Commission. Motion carried.

Mrs. Daniels commented favorably on new Bandshell erected by Optimists Club at the Rec Park and recommended that the various groups be publicly recognized by resolution or proclamation for efforts and time expended for the betterment of the community.

Mr. Witt reported on deplorable condition of Dorsey Stanton Legion Building. During the discussion it was the concensus of Council that Mr. Mauston be cited for violation repeatedly--hopefully to spur him to take some kind of permanent correct-

ive measures.

Ordinance Committee, Mr. Sterner and Mr. Lawver to work on writing a job description for the Code Enforcement Officer that would include the power of the Code Enforcement Officer to issue non-traffic citations.

Moved Mr. Ditzler seconded Mr. Cluck all approved bills (\$30,364.21) and payrolls be paid. Motion carried.

Mr. Sterner reported President of Fairfield Council had contacted him re to renting the street sweeper. Council felt they could not begin renting the equipment to other municipalities throughout the County.

Moved Mr. Ditzler seconded Mr. Cluck the Fire Company be given a permit to display fireworks during carnival on June 29 and July 2 - rain dated June 30 and July 3. Motion carried.

Moved Mr. Ditzler seconded Mr. Heflin the demand meter at the Fire Department be removed and electricity be billed to the Borough who will in turn bill the Fire Department at the municipal rate thus saving the Fire Company approximately \$2400 per year. Motion carried.

Mr. Sterner reported -

1. Next year's Revenue Sharing Funds will total \$89,547 as per preliminary report

2. Keystone Communicable will inaugurate Home Box Office May 21, 1982

3. The Borough has planted rhododendrons around trees on Lincoln Square

Mr. Lawver reported a profusion of illegal signs, for example directional yard sales, sandwich boards, etc. have appeared recently throughout the Borough.

Moved Mr. Ditzler seconded Mr. Cluck the ordinance amending the driveway ordinance to transfer responsibility for issuing permits from Mayor to Borough Manager be adopted. Motion carried.

Moved Mr. Ditzler seconded Mr. Cluck the reports of the Mayor, Chief, Treasurer and Code Enforcement Officer be accepted. Motion carried.

Moved Mr. Ditzler seconded Mr. Heflin the recommendation of HARB be accepted and a certificate of appropriateness issued to Walter Fohl and John Wills Beach for addition to an existing building at 32-34 West Middle Street. Motion carried.

Moved Mr. Heflin seconded Mr. Cluck Council approve the proposal of Walter Powell as recommended by HARB and issue a certificate of appropriateness. Motion carried.

Moved Mr. Ditzler seconded Mr. Madsen Council accept the HARB Minutes. Motion carried.

Moved Mr. Cluck seconded Mr. Madsen the Fire Marshall's report be approved. Motion carried.

Moved and seconded meeting adjourn at 9:45 PM. Motion carried.
