

PUBLIC HEARING - AMENDMENT TO ZONING ORDINANCE  
OCTOBER 11, 1982

The public hearing was called to order at 7 PM by President Shealer. Those in attendance included Council Members - Heflin, Miller, Romero, Daniels, Madsen, Witt, Ditzler, Mayor Weikert, Attorney Oyler, Chief of Police Potter, Charles Sterner, John Lawver, 7 members of Concerned Parents and their Attorney Kevin McKeon, Mike Sanders and Nancy DiBlasi.

The purpose of hearing - to receive comments from the public on the proposed amendment to Zoning Ordinance that would prohibit the operation in all zoning districts throughout the Borough of businesses dealing in the sale or lease of paraphernalia for the illicit use of controlled substances, adult bookstores and massage parlors.

Attorney McKeon, spokesman for Concerned Parents, stated the group favored passage of the amendment as drafted.

Messrs. Madsen and Ditzler commented they were in favor of the amendment. Mrs. Daniels questioned the penalties applicable should an incident be proven to be in violation. She said she felt it was not a good law, would be difficult to enforce and was concerned about the possibility of jeopardizing the Zoning Ordinance.

With no further comments the hearing adjourned at 7:15 P.M.
