

MINUTES OF MEETING HELD 10-12-81

The October meeting of Council was called to order at 7:30 PM by President Shealer. The following Councilmen were in attendance: Messrs. Ditzler, Witt, Madsen, Swope, Heflin, Miller and Cluck.

The minutes of the September meeting were approved as read.

Moved Mr. Ditzler seconded Mr. Heflin Council appoint Donald Reimer to fill the vacancy created by Mr. Delzingaro's resignation. Term to expire December 31, 1981. Motion carried.

President Shealer declared a short recess to enable Mayor Lightner to give Mr. Reimer the oath of office.

Representatives from the north end of town attended to request Council to enact a noise level ordinance and register complaint against fraternity members who harass area residents, allow accumulation of garbage or refuse on fraternity premises, play stereos a high volume, etc. Ralph Arend, Assistant Dean of Students was also present and briefly outlined some procedures adopted by the College to handle such complaints. Mayor Lightner and Sgt. Potter will meet with Mr. Arend and Inter-fraternity Council in the near future.

George Olinger requested Council reconsider the re-zoning of a property at the corner of West High & West Streets. Ordinance Committee directed to study and report at November meeting.

Don and Joanne Hinks objected to Wade Avenue being one-way. Safety Committee to again study.

Mary Stevenson, spokesperson for a group of concerned parents re alcohol and drug abuse among school age children solicited any help Council can give in that area.

Bids were opened and read for sale of 1964 Ford Dump Truck from the following: Paul C. Woodward-\$500.00; William F. Arentz, Sr.-\$405.00; A & A Auto Salvage \$756.50; Davies Used Auto Parts-\$410.00; Central Construction Company-\$1,200.00.

Moved Mr. Swope seconded Mr. Heflin the bid of Central Construction Company for \$1,200 be accepted. Motion carried.

Moved Mr. Heflin seconded Mr. Cluck the application of Finance One to repaint and change name on an approved sign be approved as HARB recommended and a certificate of appropriateness issued. Motion carried.

Mr. Swope reported Richmond Realtors, Chambersburg Street, had been contacted re their sign.

Moved Mr. Heflin seconded Mr. Ditzler Council accept the HARB Minutes. Motion carried.

Mayor Lightner reported the resignation of Chief Ronald Wells, effective September 26, 1981.

Moved Mr. Miller seconded Mr. Swope Council accept the resignation of Chief Wells, (copy of Mutual Agreement placed in Minute Book). Motion carried.

Mayor Lightner reported he had appointed Sgt. Potter as Temporary Acting Chief of Police on September 26, 1981.

Moved Mr. Swope seconded Mr. Cluck, Russell Potter be named Acting Chief of Police until December 31, 1981. Motion carried.

Moved Mr. Madsen seconded Mr. Cluck the Borough refrain from issuing parking tickets during the last ten days of Christmas Shopping season. Motion carried.

Moved Mr. Swope seconded Mr. Madsen the Retail Merchants be given permission to turn on Christmas Lights on November 27th. Motion carried majority vote-Mr. Witt dissenting.

Mr. Heflin reported 1981 highway projects are completed; also a catch basin located at 140 York Street is deteriorating--Penn Dot to be notified to repair.

Moved Mr. Miller seconded Mr. Madsen the 1982 Police Contract, with minor changes, be approved providing Police Bargaining Committee are in agreement with the changes. Motion carried.

Mr. Cluck reported Utility Committee recommends the additional lighting for Breckenridge Village be tabled for the present.

Mr. Reimer thanked Council for the consideration and appointment as 3rd Ward Councilman.

In response the question by Mr. Swope the Mayor set October 30 from 6-8 PM as Trick or Treat night.

Mr. Witt questioned status of Trinity United Church Parking Lot--was informed agreement now being prepared.

Moved Mr. Witt seconded Mr. Ditzler President Shealer be authorized to sign parking lot agreements (Trinity United Church, Chamber of Commerce, Moose) when they are ready for signature. Motion carried.

Moved Mr. Ditzler seconded Mr. Swope all approved bills (\$70,943.20) and payrolls be paid. Motion carried.

Moved Mr. Ditzler seconded Mr. Madsen the Borough Treasurer be authorized to close the HUD checking account as that project is now completed. Motion carried.

Mr. Sterner reported: 1. He and the Safety & Highway Committees had met with Penn Dot re: railroad crossing on N. Washington St. Recommended nothing be done at this time. 2. Estimate for 1982 Highway-aid Fund \$61,538.20. 3. Estimate for 1982 Revenue Sharing \$88,966.00. 4. 1st public hearing for proposed use of Revenue Sharing Fund will be held Oct. 26, 1981, 7 PM, 2nd hearing preceding Council meeting November 9, 1981, at 7 PM.

Pres. Shealer reported the Wage & Salary Board will meet Oct. 13th at 7 PM. Following the hearing Oct 26th the committees will start work on the 1982 budget.

Pres. Shealer appointed Mr. Sterner, Mr. Miller and Sgt. Sistrunk to committee to disburse income from Eichelberger-Stahle Funds at Christmas. Motion carried.

Mr. Lawver reported 17 notices had been sent for garbage or refuse; also suggested the sidewalks along State Streets be surveyed and those needing repair be submitted for notification to have the work done in 1982.

Moved Mr. Miller seconded Mr. Heflin that the dates of May 22 and September 25, 1982 be approved for Outdoor Antique Show as Retail Merchants requested. Dealers to be notified not to place displays on yellow line areas. Motion carried.

Ordinance Committee directed to study Rec Board request for an ordinance listing hours for Rec Park use.

Moved Mr. Reimer seconded Mr. Madsen the ordinance to enable GMA to provide service to Straban Twp residents along Rt 30 east of Boro to Rt 15 By-Pass be adopted. Motion carried.

Moved Mr. Madsen seconded Mr. Cluck the reports of Treasurer, Police, Mayor and Code Enforcement Officer be accepted. Motion carried.

Moved and seconded meeting adjourn at 9:50 PM. Motion carried.
