A motion to approve Change Order No. 1 of the King Street Stormwater Improvements Contract for the additional connection of three existing drain pipes to the proposed storm sewer trunk line and removal of an existing buried inlet. The Change Order also includes a credit for the existing concrete curbing that was salvaged during construction and therefore, removed from the Contract. This Change Order is a credit in the amount of -\$3,275.00 changing the total contract price to \$65,678.00.

A motion to enact an ordinance prohibiting illegal discharges into and illicit connections to the storm drain systems, the storm sewer systems and the water courses in the Borough of Gettysburg.

A motion, consistent with the Borough of Gettysburg's Fund Balance Policy, to amend the FY2019 General Fund (Fund 01) Budget, by allocating the \$135,715.00 (one-hundred thirty five thousand seven-hundred fifteen dollars) FY2018 General Fund surplus as follows:

- \$8,000.00 (eight thousand dollars) for the purchase of fuel tank probes and float repair, and
- \$4900.00 (four-thousand nine-hundred dollars) for the removal of trees at the Racehorse Alley Garage, and
- \$15,000.00 (fifteen-thousand dollars) for the purchase and replacement of (15) fifteen Windows 7 workstations with Windows 10, and
- \$1,140.00 (one-thousand one-hundred forty dollars) for the upgrade to Office 365 and to migrate existing work stations, and
- \$2,920.00 (two-thousand nine-hundred twenty dollars) to migrate the Borough's Server to Azure Cloud with backup, and
- \$3,695.00 (three-thousand six-hundred ninety five dollars) to relicense Adobe to current Adobe plus esign workflow, and
- \$15,000.00 (fifteen thousand dollars) toward the Borough of Gettysburg's sponsorship of the 120th annual Pennsylvania Municipal League Summit, and
- \$43,000.00 (forty-three thousand dollars) for the installation of a gas furnace in the Municipal Building, and
- \$5,500.00 (five-thousand five-hundred dollars) to purchase (6) six steel park benches with center armrests, and
- \$28,945.00 (twenty-eight thousand nine-hundred forty five dollars) transferred to Debt Service (Fund 23), plus any unused portion of the estimates noted above.

The remaining \$7,615.00 (seven-thousand six-hundred fifteen dollars) is to remain in General Fund Reserves.
