

**RESOLUTION NO. 030810-1**

**WHEREAS**, the Borough Council of the Borough of Gettysburg has enacted and has amended from time to time an ordinance which regulates the use of Borough streets by assemblages, processions and spontaneously planned events. Said ordinance is codified as Section 15-108 of the Code of Ordinances of the Borough of Gettysburg; and

**WHEREAS**, pursuant to subsection 8. A. of the aforesaid ordinance, the Borough Council of the Borough of Gettysburg may establish by resolution reasonable fees for the issuance of assemblage permits; and


**WHEREAS**, the Borough Council of the Borough of Gettysburg desires to adopt a resolution establishing a fee for assemblage permits issued for parades held within the Borough.

**WHEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED**, that the Borough Council of the Borough of Gettysburg does hereby adopt the following fee for assemblage permits issued for parades held within the Borough:


1. The fee for an assemblage permit to be issued for a parade shall be One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00).
2. The fees, if any, for any other assemblages, processions, or spontaneously planned events requiring an assemblage permit pursuant to Section 15-108 of the Code of Ordinances of the Borough of Gettysburg may be set by subsequent resolution of the Borough Council of the Borough of Gettysburg.
3. All other resolutions or parts of resolutions inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.
4. The provisions of this Resolution may be amended according to law by a resolution duly adopted by the Borough Council of the Borough of Gettysburg and approved by the Mayor of the Borough of Gettysburg.


